NEWS FROM YOUR SOCIETY:

Time has flown by since our last newsletter in Dec 2016. We finalized a successful major funding bid to the Greensand Country Landscape Partnership Programme, enabling us to commence the Warden Abbey Project. We also held a project launch event on 7 March, including a fascinating talk on the Warden Pear by Paul Labous, and barely had time to draw breath before the geophys survey started on 24 March. There was a lot of preparatory work behind the scenes to enlist volunteers for the geophys, prepare all necessary paperwork, and ensure that we fully satisfied permissions, health & safety, and insurance requirements.

WARDEN ABBEY PROJECT – POST SURVEY BRIEFING

It doesn't seem possible that after months of planning the geophysical survey has now been completed. It looks so easy on Time Team, but in reality, the two geophys techniques were found to be physically demanding; needing focus, concentration and teamwork.

Our volunteers were excellent; turning up on time, working hard, and very interested with what was happening and what the results would show. All of

us have learnt new skills and it was a privilege to be able to study the site in more detail.

The MOLA (Museum of London Archaeology) surveyors were very patient in explaining everything to us and were a pleasure to work with. Not all went to plan as there were some problems with the magnetometer which set us back slightly, but that was overcome and the weather was perfect throughout.

MOLA were able to download initial result 'plots' at the end of most sessions, but we now have to await their full analysis and report, expected by the end of May. Just to whet your appetite though, the earth resistance has, by showing up foundations of structures, provided an outline plan of the layout of the abbey church and cloister, and the magnetometry has provided evidence of tile and brick kilns. For those interested in garden history we may also have some hints at the layout of the late Tudor gardens surrounding the Gostwick mansion (i.e. the Landmark Trust building).

MOLA will be coming back to deliver a talk about the survey to local people and we will keep you informed about this and other events.

Armed with the geophys results the next step of the project is to commission an expert in historical reconstructive drawing to depict what our lost Abbey would have looked like. Something to fire the imagination!

Our very grateful thanks to the landowner, The Southill Estate, for granting permission to access the site – without this there would have been no project. We must also thank Richard & Nancy Batty, the tenants of Abbey Farm, and Jane Markham, manager of Warden Abbey Vineyard, for allowing volunteers the use of their facilities during the survey.
